



Co-Curricular – Code of Behaviour Level System

The following framework will be used by the Co-curricular Behaviour Committee to address the incident and to more closely align with the Downlands College Student Level System.

LEVEL	BEHAVIOURS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS LEVEL	COMMUNITY RESPONSE
<p>Level A (Day school equivalent- Level 1/2/3)</p> <p>Student is actively demonstrating positive sportsmanship/involvement and upholding the values of the College.</p>	<p>In Co-curricular activity, students must consistently demonstrate some combination of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • being notably courteous and cooperative towards coaches and supervising staff. • giving time generously for service activities or displaying initiative by offering help in setting up and packing up at College activities. • being considerate and encouraging of team members and members of opposition teams. • demonstrating commitment and consistently attending all trainings and fixtures. • wearing the College team uniform correctly and proudly and showing self-pride with their personal appearance • consistently displaying good manners. • expressing gratitude towards coaches and opposition staff and students • participating within the spirit of the activity and for its inherent enjoyment 	<p>Student will be eligible to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • hold a major leadership role e.g. – College Captains (Level 1) Sports/Cultural Captains or Activity House Captains (Levels 1&2) • hold a minor leadership role e.g. – Captains of an individual sporting team. • represent the College on sporting tours – both national and international. • receive a sports award at the annual Sports Awards Night. • be nominated as a member of a “Team of the Week” or “Best and Fairest” player. • assist at College Open Days, representing their respective sports. • be included in marketing and promotional materials highlighting the Co-curricular opportunities offered at the College.
<p>Level B (Day school equivalent- Level 4/5)</p> <p>Student is inconsistent in demonstrating sportsmanship and/or positive community involvement.</p>	<p>Student demonstrates any of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • being argumentative to a coach/staff member, umpire, referee or spectator. • being uncooperative or discourteous towards any co-curricular coach or other College or opposition team staff • ridiculing the well-intentioned efforts of other team members. • misbehaving on school buses, or at any event where the student is seen to be representing or supporting the College. • smoking at College attended co-curricular activities or being in the company of smokers. • failing to honour the commitment to team or group activities • being sent from the game by the referee/umpire during the game • engaging in a physical altercation rather than pulling teammates away from the situation. 	<p>If substantiated the student may be subjected to a range of sanctions at the Principal's or his/her delegates discretion e.g.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • student will not be able to represent the College for a period of time (from 0-6 weeks). • student to be placed onto the appropriate Level within the Downlands College student Level System.
<p>Level C (Day school equivalent- Level 6/7)</p> <p>Student has shown major disregard for sportsmanship/community involvement and has displayed inappropriate personal conduct as a College representative.</p>	<p>Student demonstrates any of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Repetition of behaviours associated with Level B • being abusive to a coach/staff member, umpire, referee or spectator. • engaging in an unprovoked physical altercation during or after the game. • purchasing, consuming or being under the influence of alcohol or other drugs <p>During Tours:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • showing disregard for evening curfew or other stated tour behavioural expectations • endangering themselves and others through inappropriate actions e.g. acquiring tattoos 	<p>If substantiated the student may be subjected to a range of sanctions at the Principal's discretion e.g.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the Principal or his/her delegate may suspend the student from school, pending a decision on the length of the suspension from the co-curricular activity (for the full season if warranted). • student to be placed onto the appropriate Level within the Downlands College student Level System. • during this period, the student and his/her parents will be required to attend an interview with the Principal or his/her delegate to discuss the student's future in co-curricular activities for the remainder of the season. • the Principal or delegate will determine if the student attends further sporting tours. • exclusion from the College.
